

What is the Member Assistance Program (MAP)?

The Member Assistance program (MAP) is a confidential service-based program. Easy access to counseling or treament is a primary goal. Members should feel confident that their needs will be met professionally

What is the purpose of MAP?

The purpose of MAP is to provide members and their families with a confidential, readily-accessible resource for assistance in resolving conflicts and achieving personal goals

Is using MAP confidential?

Self-referral to MAP is confidential unless there is a significant and immediate danger to the member, the organization, or the public

Who is eligible to participate?

All members are eligible to participate in MAP

WITH group health insurance coverage:

The member and covered dependents are eligible to participate in the Member Assistance Program. Claims should be submitted through their group health insurance

- Five visits per calendar year are available (each session is one hour) at no cost to the member and covered dependents
- The member or covered dependents must use a PPO provider listed under "Psychologist" or "Psychiatrist" services

WITHOUT group health insurance coverage:

Members who do not elect group health insurance are still eligible to participate in the Member Assistance Program. This benefit is only extended to the member and not his/her dependents. These claims should be submitted to First Service Administrators, Inc. for payment.

- Five visits per calendar year are available at no cost to the member. Each session is one hour
- The member must use a PPO provider listed under "Psychologist" or "Psychiatrist" services

Who benefits from MAP?

Members

- Every member is valuable
- Members learn to take better care of themselves as well as others
- Restoration of mental and emotional well-being
- Renewing hopes, ambitions, dreams
- Realizing loved ones care for them and need them

Families

- Work problems may originate at home
- Family problems may originate at work
- Family problems often affect the spirit and health of the member

Organizations

- 80% of all medical problems have a stress, anxiety or psychological origin
- Alcohol and drug abuse costs businesses over 98 billion dollars per year
- Nearly 25% of American workers are substance abusers

What if I need to take time off work?

Absences from work while participating in the MAP are treated the same as any other medical absence. For all absences of four or more days, sick leave must be documented by a medical care provider within fifteen days. Supervisors are held to the same confidentiality requirements as for all types of medical absences.

What additional coverage is available through the CCSO health insurance?

<u>Smoking cessation</u> coverage, prior to deductible and depending upon the health plan you choose, covers a maximum amount of \$200 or \$250. This applies for treatment rendered by a PPO Provider.

<u>Gross obesity</u> coverage, prior to deductible and depending upon the health plan you choose, covers a minimum amount of \$250. Members may be eligible for a maximum coverage of \$850. This applies for treatment rendered by a PPO Provider.
