

REINTEGRATION SERVICES

Reintegration Specialists meet with inmates one-on-one to ask them a series of questions to help assess their needs properly. During this interaction, staff get a detailed look at what the inmate's basic needs are, and are able to assist them in meeting those needs by linking them with community partners. This ensures they have the best chance of success after release. Inmates can also be referred to some of the Inmate Programs that might fit their immediate needs while in jail. In addition to the one-on-one assistance, the Collier County Jail also has self-help programs on its Mobile Kiosks that assist inmates in areas of education, recovery, life skills and faith-based material. Each self-help program completed is documented in a student transcript the inmate can request a copy of at any time. These transcripts can then help them continue their journey on the outside by providing proof of the efforts they made while incarcerated.



WHAT WE DO


Reintegration Specialists focus on inmates that have a release date within sixty days. They interview the inmate and determine what basic needs are required for the inmate prior to their release. Reintegration Specialists connect inmates with community partners who will provide necessary services. This is an essential step in helping the inmate succeed after release.

Basic needs the Reintegration Specialists provide assistance / referrals with are:

- Finding resources for food and clothing
- Making arrangements for a shelter or housing needs
- Connecting inmates to mental health services
- Assisting with the admissions process for substance use treatment programs
- Assisting with the Treatment Court process
- Providing resources for health insurance and free clinic information
- Connecting inmates with job placement resources
- Scheduling one-on-one trauma counseling
- Providing pregnant females resources and referring them to services
- Obtaining birth certificates
- Obtaining Social Security replacement cards
- Preparing inmates with continuing their education
- Providing inmates NA & AA material
